The impact of Local Government Led Public Health

We are looking for a senior public health specialty registrar to support the ADPH policy team in a short project for up to 3 months, ideally full-time, but part-time would be considered.

The project will result in a paper which answers the key questions:

What has been the impact of Public Health in England since transfer of functions on 1st April 2013? How has delivery changed since before 2012?

1. Commissioning

What has been the impact nationally since transfer of public health functions in terms of numbers of patient and service user episodes and outcomes?

How have trends changed since before 2013?

How have cuts impacted on delivery (including waiting times) and outcomes?

What is the spend per outcome since 2013 compared to before?

What is the spend per outcome since cuts have been imposed compared to before?

2. Wider impact and added benefits

With a national lens, what has been the wider impact on determinants of public health since local government assumed responsibility for Directors of Public Health compared to before?

What has been the impact on health inequalities?

Competencies

1. Commissioning element: It is anticipated that this part of the work will largely be numerical and health economical in analysis
2. Wider impact and added benefits: This piece of the work would be largely analysis of documents (policy documents, trends etc) with a select number of telephone interviews with key stakeholders to identify impact.
3. Narrative skills – crafting the document for wider use in policy development and ADPH submission to the 2019 Comprehensive Spending Review; this would include the use of personal stories to illustrate, for example, improved access to transformed / modernised services.

Timing

To be negotiated, but ideally to start as soon as possible – this is a time critical piece of work that will inform the ADPH submission the next year's Spending Review.

Project supervisor

The day to day oversight will be from Isobel Howe, the ADPH Head of Policy and Deputy CEO

Location

Although there may be some occasions to meet with staff at the ADPH office is in London, it is envisaged that this piece could be done virtually via phone and email.
