ADPH supports call for more investment in public health

ADPH has welcomed a new briefing paper by The Health Foundation which calculates that an additional £3.2 billion a year of public health funding for local authorities is needed.

ADPH Chief Executive, Nicola Close, said:

"The Health Foundation has laid bare the scale of cuts in funding for essential public health services such as obesity programmes, drug and alcohol treatment and sexual health.

"Directors of Public Health have been relentlessly focussed on effectively managing the cuts, in the context of increasing demand, whilst also modernising services.

"However, it is now clear that without £3.2 billion of investment for public health reductions in services are inevitable and the potential of prevention, including to tackle the social determinants of ill health, cannot be realised."
