A peer-led educational approach to health promotion for secondary schools. Social prescribing- at scale

ABOUT

A team of 8-10 young people from each school (aged 14-18) are provided with the skills, knowledge, and confidence to act as peer mentors, role models, signposters and educators
Training is delivered in-school during a two-day RSPH accredited Level 2 programme
YHCs research local health services and public health issues, design and deliver health promotion campaigns to raise awareness

•The programme **promotes** good health and wellbeing to YHCs themselves, their peers, families and wider community network

•Developing the **future** public health workforce, many YHC's go into careers in health and social care- and public health

In Southend, the YHC team have joined the Youth Parliament. One of our new programmes, the Southend YHC's are proactive and actively advise the public health team – and two schools have been awarded the Jack Petchey award for their innovative campaigns.

SEN students from St Christophers School have benefitted from the YHC programme by gaining the qualifications- helping with college applications In Waltham Forest there are now 12 participating schools with over 540 YHC's trained and actively delivering health promotion campaigns on topics including:

- Vaccination uptake
- Vaping risks and dangers
- Personal and community safety
- Improving mental wellbeing
- Safe social media use
- STI awareness and prevention
