

The East of England Local Knowledge and Intelligence Service (LKIS) sits within the Population Health Analysis Unit (PHAU) in the Office for Health Improvement and Disparities (OHID) within the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC).

The aim of our service is to support effective local public health action through the delivery of high quality analysis, provision of expert advice and training and the facilitation of local networks for partners across the system.

Why do we need to increase capability in the use of public health intelligence?
