Revised Statutory Guidance: Relationships Education, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and Health Education

Published in July 2025 by the Department of Education, this guidance updates the existing requirements for teaching relationships education, relationships and sex education (RSE) and health education in schools. This will be effective from 1st September 2026.

These revised guidelines include more detailed content on gambling and gambling harms at both primary and secondary school levels.

At primary school, students will learn about why certain online content - including gambling - is age restricted and explores the risks of online gaming.

At secondary school, students will learn about the mental health impacts of gambling and the risks of online gambling and in-game content.

These revisions highlight the importance of educating children and young people about gambling harms to help them make decisions about their health and wellbeing.
