1. Regional SLI Quarterly Report – July 2022

The South West regional SLI quarterly report was submitted on the 14th of July. The 22/23 SLI Action plan was shared, the plan on a page is inputted below and will be uploaded to the SW ADPH website. This action plan has been signed off by all SW DsPH and each Key Objective (KO) will have corresponding key outputs of intended work attached as the programmes progress. 2. SLI – Health Protection: A Review of Local Authority Business

Public Health Dorset (PHD) have recently reviewed their health protection function using the South West UKHSA SLI tool and a series of interviews. Topics included: Health Protection Assurance Framework; Immunisations; Screening; Infection Control; Environment; and Emergency Preparedness, Resilience, and Response.

The work reminds us of the statutory health protection responsibilities of local authorities and Directors of Public Health. The output from the SLI tool has provided PHDs senior management team and directors of public health with a snapshot of what is currently in place. It has inevitably led to further points for consideration and highlights opportunities to build resilience across the public health and local authority teams.

Additional scoping will soon commence to consider health protection across the local health system. The formation of the integrated care system, lessons learned from the COVID-19 response, and partnership working will be important considerations.
