1. Bids for the Vaccine Engagement SLI Programme Fund

In the previous monthly snapshot, we advertised our regional bid process for local authorities to apply for the ADPH/LGA/NHSE national funding allocation for Vaccine Engagement. We have received 6 bids from the South West region and would like to thank the local authorities for taking the time to submit these to us by the deadline. 5 out of the 6 bids will be successful in gaining the £5k funding to undertake their proposal for supporting vaccine uptake. We hope the bid process provides the opportunity to help a local area build on successes from the COVID-19 vaccine deployment, such as use of community insight and intelligence, local leadership and collaborative relationships. The successful bids can focus on what works and why and from this we aim to share innovation regionally to inform the delivery of vaccinations in the future.

The bid proposals have undergone analysis following an evaluation template by three evaluators: Ruth Harrell DPH Plymouth and lead on the Vaccine Engagement SLI work, Emma Kain Consultant in Public Health, Screening and Immunisations Lead (nominated by Julie Yates) and Jonathan Roberts Consultant in Health Protection UKHSA (nominated by Dominic Mellon).
