Public Health Intelligence

As part of the South West Practice Improvement Programme, this priority area is focused on exploring how public health teams support the local system and gaining a better understanding on the public and population health intelligence functions in local authorities. The project also aims to strengthen alignment with regional teams and build a shared evidence base of "what good looks like" through best practice examples.

Survey Success



A regional survey was completed by all South West local authorities, achieving a 100% response rate. The results were analysed and presented back to Directors of Public Health and intelligence leads/consultants during a regional workshop.

Workshop Highlights

The workshop, jointly led by Simon Chant and Simon Packer, through synthesised qualitative and quantitative data explored:



- Team structures and functions
- Relationships within and across systems
- · Access to and use of data

Key findings

- The South West region has strong and skilled PHI teams and individuals.
- High demand for PHI services is a challenge for the relatively small workforce.



- · Significant variation in team size, job roles, and data access
- Strong leadership and analytical capability across the region
- Opportunities to improve co-production, data architecture, and consistency

The session included rich discussion on the benefits and challenges of current arrangements, with a focus on shaping next steps.





Showcasing Innovation

Each local authority has contributed a case study highlighting innovative and impactful public health intelligence work. These examples will help build a regional picture of best practice.

Next Steps

 Collate feedback and discussion points from the workshop to inform future recommendations



- Produce local authority-specific reports benchmarking responses

- Host a dedicated SWINPHO workshop with the public health analytical community to codevelop further actions and solutions
