Smoke Free Generation

A note from our Smoke Free Generation priority leads:

I want to take this opportunity to extend my sincere thanks to all public health colleagues, associated partners, and organisations across the South West who have contributed to increasing engagement with our SW stop smoking services.

Last year, stop smoking engagement across the SW was 14,961 service users. Our collective ambition for 2024/25 was to increase that to 19,725, we surpassed that with a final position of 25,722 smokers setting a quit date with local services. That is more than 10,000 extra SW residents and represents an increase of 72%.

Your collective effort, innovation, and effective implementation of the 'Local stop smoking services and support grant' has made a real difference in reaching more smokers and ensuring that they get access to the most effective way to quit. The impact of this is enormous, as it will mean less cardiovascular events, less cancer, less COPD, less mortality and translates into many more real-world health benefits for the SW population we serve.

This progress is only possible because of your hard work, creativity, and commitment to collaboration. The impact you are having goes beyond numbers—it is improving lives and strengthening the foundations of health and wellbeing across our region.
