System Leadership

- Embed health inequalities, prevention and population health management across the system, including within ICSs.
- Retain a central position contributing to national system development, for example with ADPH national and the new national professional leadership.

Quality Improvement Programme

- Work collaboratively to develop a shared programme of quality improvement, for example;
- Vaccinations
- Mental well-being
- Tobacco control
- Health Protection
- Plan for impact in our shared priority topics through sharing best practice and learning.
- Adopt a quality improvement way of working.

Developing the Workforce

- Ensure the public health work force across the region is flexible for future scenarios.
- Grow the capacity of consultants across the region through improvements in the Training Scheme
- Engage the consultant workforce into regional action
- Improve diversity and inclusion in the public health workforce at all levels across the region

Mitigating Child Poverty

- Adoption of mitigating child poverty as a three year priority across the public health system and partners in the region
- Drive regional action to mitigate child poverty through system working and playing to strengths.
- Maximise influencing opportunities at regional and national levels.
- Adopt a quality Improvement approach in all measures and outcomes impacting child poverty.
