

## ADPH/THT – Sexual Health Conference – 16<sup>th</sup> March 2009

### Evaluation Report

26 delegates attended from which 23 (88%) completed an evaluation form

- 23 (100%) thought the day was a good use of their time
- 22 (96%) had made new contacts
- 23 (100%) had learnt something new
- 22 (96%) felt that they had made a valuable contribution to the decision making process

#### ***Specific actions delegates intended to make***

- Lots! More proactive leadership for SH agenda plus engage other champions x 2
- Action points noted throughout the day – HIV network, chlamydia tips, teenage pregnancy risk assessment x 2
- Try and get sexual health leadership in new PCT public health role. Pull together current roles.
- Use priorities in “a sexual revolution” to develop regional plan.
- Need to map out services, data, infrastructure, etc. for a comprehensive needs assessment for HIV and sexual health, need to review existing commissioning and provide service delivery and structures.
- Contact other commissioners re specific elements of presentations eg risk or screening. Determine how to obtain GUM data to LSOA (lower super output area) level in combination with service provider and PH.
- Look at Chlamydia screening and interventions THT have used to increase screening rate. As prioritising SH health promotion in sexual health commissioning.
- Pursue sexual health indicators through regional SHA/WMPHO route similar to SWPHO model.
- Investigate opportunities to improve intelligence from GUM x 5
- New knowledge from PBC speaker.
- Explore PBC route for commissioning, use 5 steps in “simplifying” SH at PCT
- Use of risk assessment tool from Sex and the City (Birmingham)
- Review teenage pregnancy actions. Explore PBC opportunities, using info and contacts to help take forward our current service re-design x 2
- Look at GP competency training on aspects of sexual health and toolkit (Lambeth) to help GP assess risk.
- Get Midlands SHIP training.
- Get out and talk to teachers and engage with public to a greater degree.

#### ***What was the most useful aspect of the day***

- Presentations helped to give the day clarity and workshops gave useful discussion
- Excellent standard of speakers and good range of perspectives. Good size and relevance of people attending
- Morning presentations x 10

#### Content

- More examples of good practice and implementing change x 4
- Knowing what THT are doing within some of the delegates' PCT area
- More on world class commissioning and social marketing
- Focus further on HIV/LTC area. Seems work is further along re SH when compared to HIV
- Potential – key areas of concern and solutions, e.g. de-hosting
- Involvement of NST for SH & TP

#### Venue and structure

- Couldn't hear discussions around table in afternoon and / or couldn't see slides in the morning x 5
- Timing workshop either at beginning of financial year or in the autumn to coincide with finalising commissioning intentions of PCTs
- Groups were good, but fewer questions for discussion / different questions for each group?
- Presentations ready beforehand to use as script.

- Praise and thankyou X 9:  
eg "Great Event - many thanks"; "day has been incredibly valuable"; "very useful day giving food for thought and practical ideas"; "staff very friendly, venue very good - accessible, good food and lovely garden"
- Would welcome development of ongoing network for SH commissioners X 2
- Five steps is a useful publication
- Useful to know role of ADPH - would welcome other workshops, e.g. smoking and alcohol
- Link in with NSMC in using SM to address some of the WCC competencies
- How do we influence Faculty objectives to raise profile of Sexual Health?
