

Peer support

The Peer Support scheme has been a long-standing element of ADPH membership and it is available to all members. Its purpose is to match members with colleagues from across geographies who might face similar types of issues. This scheme does not involve any formal training or specifications around time commitment required. Rather than being based on guiding and mentoring, it relies on mutual support through sharing experiences and challenges in a safe environment and on flexible terms.

How it works

ADPH collects applications from interested members and matches them with colleagues based on their preference where possible. After an introductory email, it is up to both participants to set the expectations of the relationship and to arrange meetings or teleconferences.

Eligibility

All Full, Affiliate and Associate members.

Exchange visits

These one-off visits are a good development opportunity for those DsPH who cannot commit to a longer-term supportive relationship or for other reasons do not wish to participate in the Peer Support scheme. These shadowing visits are organised on a voluntary basis and they combine a hands-on learning experience with an opportunity to receive peer feedback. A big benefit of this support element is that it offers an opportunity to gather a wide range of experience from a number of different colleagues.

How it works

ADPH collects applications from interested members and matches them with colleagues based on their preference where possible. After an introductory email, it is up to both participants to arrange the visits at their convenience.

All Full, Affiliate and Associate members.

Mentoring

ADPH is currently working with PHE on the delivery of a mentoring scheme to new-in-post DsPH and we hope to be able to extend this offer to aspiring DsPH. The purpose of this scheme is to match DsPH who have only recently been appointed to their role with their more experienced colleagues. The scheme will involve training for interested DsPH who wish to serve as mentors. The training session for the first cohort of mentors is scheduled for 14th July with further sessions potentially available in the autumn.

How it works

ADPH encourages all eligible DsPH to sign up for the scheme. Upon completion of the training with elements of coaching the mentors will be matched to mentees based on an indicated set of criteria and preference. Both mentees and mentors will be expected to commit to a certain number of hours over the period of one year.

Eligibility

Mentors: Full members with at least 3 years of experience in a substantive DPH post who are able to complete the mentoring training.

Mentees: Full members with at most 2 years of experience in a DPH post.
