Statement on the newly published Tobacco Control Plan

ADPH welcomes the publication of the Tobacco Control Plan for England.

The Association of Directors of Public Health (ADPH) welcomes the publication of the Tobacco Control Plan for England and is pleased that ambitious targets have been set to reduce smoking rates and prevalence by 2022. ADPH welcomes the focus on tackling the inequality gap in smoking prevalence, supporting those with mental health conditions to quit and the prioritisation of reducing rates of smoking in pregnancy.

ADPH President Dr Andrew Furber said:

“We are pleased that the government has committed to reducing smoking rates and published this national plan to achieve a ‘smokefree generation’.

Focusing on prevention and local action is vital to bring down smoking rates and we are pleased that the plan contains a commitment to work with Directors of Public Health to identify local solutions.

However, resources are necessary to implement these local solutions and currently resources are not following rhetoric.

The announced cuts to public health funding total £531 million. Reversal of these cuts is vital to ensure that the ambitions of the Tobacco Control Plan can be delivered. A levy or license fee on tobacco manufacturers would be one way of achieving this.”
