Event Evaluation

“Helpful policy focus”

“Important, enjoyable, essential”

This year’s DPH Workshop offered delegates the chance to discuss key issues in public health policy as well as the wider public health system. The workshop was considered engaging, informative and action-focused. A total of 48 delegates attended the workshop, with 20 providing feedback indicating that they enjoyed and valued the opportunities and activities offered on the day. Of the 20 evaluation forms submitted, 100% of respondents said that the day was a good use of their time and that they learnt something new, with 95% advising that they made useful contacts.

The discussion sessions held throughout the day were found to be particularly useful, with the Sharing Practice session on Sector Led Improvement highlighted as providing a valuable chance to learn about the work in other regions and the ways in which colleagues are overcoming local challenges. Delegates considered the most useful part of the day to be the afternoon session on public health approach to violence, and in particular Niven Rennie and Lib Peck’s presentations. The afternoon session prompted good discussions, with delegates expressing their intentions to work more closely with their community safety colleagues to plan and update the violence reduction strategy in their local authorities.

The most notable suggestion from delegates was to increase the time allocated for table discussions. Suggested topics for future events included population health, air quality and Integrated Care Systems.
