ADPH in the News

Over the Christmas period, Prof. Jim McManus, ADPH President, took part in <u>'Jamie Oliver's takeover'</u> on BBC Radio 4's Today programme. In the programme, Jim spoke to BiteBack 2030's National Youth Board Chair, Luke Hall, about how and why food policy needs to change. Jim returned to the <u>Today programme</u>

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later in the week to discuss the effectiveness of wearing masks and other ways to limit the spread of respiratory infections. The new year brought with it a new Presidential blog, in which Jim detailed his predictions for 2023, and the challenges and opportunities DsPH may face in the coming year. He also featured in an episode of the Training in Public Health podcast, where he spoke about leadership skills in public and reflected on ADPH's 175th anniversary. In the last week, ADPH have issued a press release to mark the bicentennial of Edward Jenner's death, the pioneer of vaccine development. Chief Medical Officer, Chris Whitty, and Gloucestershire DPH, Siobhan Farmer, attended a celebratory event at Gloucester Cathedral in which the CMO gave a talk on the impact of vaccines on global health. We also issued statements in response to the Government's announcement on their intention to develop a new Major Conditions Strategy and that the Health Disparities White Paper will no longer be published.

UKHSA are changing the way they present Covid-19 death statistics. "Deaths with Covid-19 on the death registration" will replace "deaths within 28 days of a positive test" as the primary reported Covid-19 death statistic. DHSC | Secretary of State announces new £250 million budget to speed up hospital discharge in House of Commons | 9 January

The DHSC has <u>announced</u> up to £250 million will be spent to help speed up hospital discharge, along with the announcement of six national Discharge Frontrunners, who will be leading the way in exploring new long-term initiatives to free up hospital beds. These frontrunners are Sussex Health and Care ICS, The Northern Care Alliance, Humber and North Yorkshire ICS, One Croydon Alliance, Leeds Health and Care Partnership, Warwickshire Place. UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) | Enhanced genome sequencing for hospitalised patients with returning from China | 3 January

The UKHSA cascaded guidance to NHS healthcare professionals, with a request to identify any Covid-19 hospitalised cases who have arrived from China in the preceding 14 days for expedited sequencing. This is a precautionary measure which will allow UKHSA to undertake enhanced surveillance of Covid-19 variants from individuals in hospital who have recently travelled to China.

CMO & DHSC Healthy Places Policy Team | January

The DHSC Healthy Places Policy Team and CMO would like to share this new e-learning module from Public Health England titled 'Helping People Living in Cold Homes'. This has been developed to empower professionals to direct people in cold homes to appropriate services that can provide support.

DHSC | Call for Flu Vaccinations | January
