# **ADPH in the News**

This month, we released a <u>supporting statement</u> for the Government's proposed legislation on creating a smokefree generation and our policy lead for addiction, Alice Wiseman, was quoted in the <u>Mirror</u> about the need for restrictions on the sale of nicotine pouches. Alice also discussed minimum unit pricing of alcohol with The Sunday Sun. Elsewhere, Greg Fell, ADPH President, has spoken to the <u>LGC</u> about <u>charging clean air zones</u> and their impact on air pollution and former ADPH President, Jim McManus and our Policy Lead for Children and Young People, Sarah Muckle, contributed to the LGA's series on <u>children's mental health</u>. We also <u>celebrated</u> the third anniversary of the <u>Inequalities in Health Alliance</u> and supported the launch of a new <u>report</u> from the <u>Royal College of Psychiatrists</u> on mental health in babies and children under five. Also this month, the <u>Local Government Association</u> released a <u>report</u> to mark the tenth anniversary of public health transferring to local government, which included interviews with both Alice Wiseman and Matt Ashton, our policy lead for healthy places.

The <u>National Institute for Health and Care Research</u> has announced the next round of research briefs which will be considered by the Programme's Prioritisation Committee in January 2024. They are looking for input into the following three briefs: 'Interventions to support children and young people in contact with the criminal justice system', 'Health and health inequalities of developer contributions' and 'Interventions that impact overcrowding in UK housing'. # The Health Foundation | Public perceptions of health and social care | 27<sup>th</sup> September

<u>The Health Foundation</u> have published the <u>results</u> of their latest round of public polling, to understand the public's priorities for health and care ahead of the general election. This is the fourth wave of their public perceptions research with <u>Ipsos</u> that tracks the UK's views every six months.

#### UKHSA | Annual HIV surveillance data published | 3<sup>rd</sup> October

<u>UKHSA</u> has published its <u>annual data set setting out HIV surveillance data</u> by demographic characteristics and geographical region. Accompanying this is the <u>2023 report</u> which presents the data on HIV testing, HIV pre-exposure prophylaxis (PEP), post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP), new HIV diagnoses, late diagnoses, and the care outcomes for people accessing HIV services.

#### DHSC | Social care worker recruitment | 10<sup>th</sup> October

<u>DHSC</u> has launched the <u>'Made With Care'</u> campaign for 2023 to encourage people to begin a career in adult social care.

# Department for Education (DfE) | School mental health | 10<sup>th</sup> October

To mark World Mental Health Day, <u>DfE</u> published a range of materials, including a <u>blog</u> for parents/carers and professionals. There is also a <u>summary of findings</u> from the mental health support team school and college survey.

#### UKHSA | Covid-19 and flu communications toolkit | 11<sup>th</sup> October

<u>UKHSA</u> has published a <u>press release</u> to encourage people to take up both the flu and Covid-19 vaccines ahead of winter. <u>Recent UKHSA modelling</u> shows last year's flu vaccinations prevented around 25,000 hospitalisations in England. UKHSA has also released a stakeholder communications <u>toolkit</u>.

NHS England | Guidance on patient confidentiality on STIs and HIV | 12<sup>th</sup> October

This <u>guidance</u> provides advice on patient confidentiality and the sharing of information on sexually transmitted infections and HIV in England.

**LGA** | Make It Local: local government's vital role in addressing economic activity | 16<sup>th</sup> October The Local Government Association (LGA) commissioned <u>Shared Intelligence</u> to research and review the range of action taken at a local level to help economically inactive people get work. The findings of this research have now been <u>published</u>.

**NHS England | Reducing the risk of ill health for people with a learning disability | 17<sup>th</sup> October** <u>NHS England</u>, in collaboration with <u>West Yorkshire Health and Care Partnership</u>, has launched a free <u>online</u> <u>training programme</u> to help reduce the risk of health deterioration for people with a learning disability.

**Maternal Mental Health Alliance | Briefing: Mental Health Experiences Of Young Mums | 18<sup>th</sup> October** <u>This briefing</u> from the <u>Maternal Mental Health Alliance</u> explores the mental health experiences of young mums. Findings from a rapid review of the literature and focus groups with young mums from across the UK show that young mums aged 16-25 are at higher risk of experiencing mental health problems during pregnancy and after birth. It also finds that they face barriers in accessing support and, where they do access support, experiences of services can be poor.

# The Health Foundation | Framework for local government action | October 2023

<u>The Health Foundation</u> has published a <u>framework for local government action</u> to address local harms from alcohol, tobacco and unhealthy food. The briefing aims to support local authorities in England to work across their teams and includes examples of approaches taken by different councils as well as links to relevant legislation.

#### **RCPCH | Health inequalities and climate change campaign | 17th October**

The <u>Royal College of Paediatrics and Child Health's</u> <u>Shift the Dial</u> on Climate Change and Health Inequalities campaign was launched mid-october. They are calling for all four UK Governments to prioritise children's health in climate change policy development and provide tools aiming to upskill pediatricians.

#### DHSC | Shared outcomes toolkit for integrated care systems | 19<sup>th</sup> October

DHSC has published a <u>toolkit</u> designed to share experience and insights for developing shared outcomes across the health and care system. The toolkit, developed with national stakeholders and local place leaders, includes case studies of good practice, suggestions for overcoming challenges, and example frameworks.

#### DHSC | Accelerating Reform Fund | 24th October

<u>DHSC</u> has announced a £42.6 million <u>Accelerating Reform Fund (ARF)</u> to support innovation in local areas to boost quality and accessibility of adult social care in England. More information can be found in DHSC's <u>guidance for local authorities</u>.

# UKHSA | Quarterly report: Tuberculosis in England | 26<sup>th</sup> October

UKHSA has released the latest <u>quarterly report</u> of tuberculosis in England. This quarter they have added one extra figure showing the cumulative numbers of TB notifications by month for the pre-pandemic year of 2019 compared with the last three years.

#### Use of Public Health Grant in England | MJ article
