To mark <u>World Aid's Day</u>, and <u>PrEP Awareness Week</u> we published our updated <u>policy statement</u> on sexual health, which was developed in collaboration with our policy advisory group on prevention services.

Read our <u>response</u> to the Government's <u>consultation</u> on creating a smokefree generation and tackling youth vaping which details why we agree that the age of sale for tobacco products should be raised.

## **ADPH** in the News

At the end of November, we issued a <u>joint statement</u> with the <u>LGA</u> and <u>EHSHCG</u> in response to a <u>new study</u> on PrEP and <u>welcomed news</u> that the opt-out screening scheme for blood borne viruses is to be extended. Alice Wiseman, ADPH Vice President, was <u>quoted</u> in relation to <u>new polling</u> which revealed that 67% of people support the proposed legislation to raise the age of sale of tobacco products. Alice was quoted in <u>Dental Nursing</u> about the proposals, as well as in <u>coverage</u> following a <u>press release by ASH</u> on the cost of smoking.

In this month's <u>Presidential blog</u>, Greg Fell discusses the ADPH Annual Conference. We also issued a <u>press release</u> about this year's ADPH Awards and the <u>Lancashire Telegraph</u> featured a story about one of the winners, the Blackburn with Darwen PH Team.

Our <u>support of the new vaccination strategy</u> from <u>NHS England</u> was covered on <u>BBC news</u> and in <u>UK Times</u> and <u>the Times</u> published a <u>letter</u> from Greg Fell and Matt Ashton, Policy Lead for Healthy Places, responding to a recent investigation into KFC. Elsewhere, <u>the Guardian</u> announced Greg's inclusion on their 'Alternative Manifesto' panel (to be held in February) and we issued a <u>joint statement with FPH</u> in response to the COP28 agreement.

This week, our <u>response</u> to the <u>Culture Media & Sport Committee's report on gambling harm</u>, backing its calls to do more to protect children and young people from gambling, was covered by <u>LocalGov</u>.
