# LGA/ADPH | 2025 Public Health Annual Conference | 1st-3rd April

Registration is now <u>open</u> for our public health annual conference, held in partnership with the <u>LGA</u>. This year, we will explore addressing health inequalities, with a particular focus on local government and system-wide perspectives.

#### ADPH Projects funded by The Health Foundation | Update

Last year, ADPH received funding from <u>The Health Foundation</u> to undertake a three-year project focusing on three topics: Commercial Determinants of Health (CDOH), Healthy Places, and Infants, Children and Young People (ICYP). It is now just over 18 months since we started the projects, and we wanted to share some of the progress that has been made in year two!

**CDOH:** This year, we have endorsed two new toolkits - <u>CDOH Essentials</u> and the <u>Good Governance toolkit</u>, both designed to help public health professionals raise awareness of the issues around CDOH with colleagues. We have also delivered two webinars with <u>FrameWorks UK</u>, focusing on how to communicate CDOH to different audiences and have developed <u>recommendations</u> to support CDOH discussions. <u>Find</u> out more.

**Healthy Places:** We have published a <u>resource</u> to outline methods for embedding health into the planning process and also supported the <u>LGA</u> with its <u>new guide</u>. We have also formed a Planning and Health Collaborative Group, and we are working with OHID to develop a 'What Good Local Planning for Health Looks Like'. <u>Find out more</u>.

**ICYP:** Last year, we organised a workshop with <u>FrameWorks UK</u> on communicating about adversity, trauma, and resilience in ICYP. A set of <u>recommendations</u>, endorsed by ADPH, <u>The Health Foundation</u>, the <u>School and Public Health Nurses Association</u>, <u>Institute of Health Visiting</u>, and <u>NHS Scotland</u>, was also published. We are now working on a 'What Good Looks Like' tool. <u>Find out more</u>.

## Glasgow | The Thistle Centre | 13th January

<u>Glasgow City Health and Social Care Partnership</u>, working with <u>NHS Greater Glasgow and Clyde</u> amongst other partners, has developed a pilot Safer Drug Consumption Facility (SDCF) known as <u>the Thistle Centre</u>, the first of its kind to be opened in the United Kingdom.

SDCFs provide a supervised healthcare setting where individuals can inject drugs obtained elsewhere in the

presence of health and social care professionals. The primary goal of this initiative is to minimise the health risks associated with drug injection and to provide individuals with the necessary support to seek help and improve their overall wellbeing. The service also aims to reduce the harmful effects of outdoor drug use, benefiting local communities.

The centre is a significant move towards addressing the complex issues surrounding drug use with a focus on harm. Read our <u>press release</u> welcoming the centre's opening.
