Wales | Healthcare public health framework | 17th July

<u>Public Health Wales</u> has coproduced a <u>healthcare public</u> <u>health framework</u> to support the NHS in Wales in becoming a preventive, equitable, sustainable, and learning healthcare system.



The framework seeks to provide both a whole system vision as well as practical guidance through principles and <u>tools</u> for integrating public health principles into healthcare planning and delivery. It also features worked examples on cardiovascular disease and fall prevention, addressing inequalities in waiting lists and prevention of fragility fractures.
