ADPH infants, children, and young people (ICYP) webinar | 27th October (15:00-16:30)

Yesterday, we held the second webinar in our virtual series on adversity, trauma and resilience in ICYP, in collaboration with <u>Dr Warren Larkin</u> (Consultant Clinical Psychologist and Managing Director, <u>Warren Larkin Associates</u>).

The webinar, which was chaired by our lead for children and young people, Sarah Muckle, explored the cost of delayed disclosure, the barriers faced by service users in being heard and believed, and the importance of routine and targeted enquiry to get service users to share their experiences to get suitable and effective help.

It also covered the evidence for adverse childhood experience enquiry in the UK and US and shared recommendations for good practice drawn from evaluations of the <u>REACh model</u>.

ADPH in the news


October has seen the following media activity from ADPH:

I had a brilliant social history teacher in the 70's and even at the age of 15, hearing about social determinants of health, especially in relation to early years, education, employment, housing, and health gave me some insight into the avoidable impact of social and health inequalities. I didn't know it then, but this was the beginning of a journey that would lead to me being a Director of Public Health.

I started my career in public health way back when I was a student nurse in Wakefield in the 1980's, it's hard to believe now but patients smoked in the

ward areas and day rooms in the early part of my career. I have a really strong memory of a patient who

was at end of life with COPD, he was struggling to breathe, harmed by tobacco addiction, and smoking a cigarette. He talked about how he wanted everyone to stop smoking and no one to start. Even now I can remember how helpless I felt in terms of what I could offer him, apart from kindness, compassion, and care.


It reignited my curiosity about upstream preventative interventions and my interest in public health...


